



Argument and counter-argument

- An argument involves the process of establishing a claim and then proving it with the use of logical reasoning, examples, and research.
- Addressing the claims of the opposition is an important component in building a convincing argument. It demonstrates your credibility.
- Build rapport to maintain the conversation through mirroring and positive modeling.
